Why We Partner with SBTS

Spend any time at all in Greenville, and you aren’t far from The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary—at least, not far from its rich legacy. You’ll drive down streets named Boyce, Broadus, Manly, Whitsitt, and Williams—each last name honoring a member of the seminary’s founding faculty. Down McBee Avenue, as you head into downtown, look closely and you’ll find a historical marker, marking the location where those men taught the first SBTS classes 1859.

SBTS remained in Greenville until 1877, but the Civil War left the school financially desecrated, forcing it to move to Louisville that year, where it remains—and thrives—today. SBTS’s beginnings were decidedly humble, boasting two borrowed classrooms in the Baptist building and a handful of eager students.

Today, Southern is the world’s largest evangelical seminary with more than 5,000 students. Over 165 years, it has prepared and propelled thousands of graduates into gospel ministry across the globe—pastors, missionaries, evangelists, biblical counselors, Bible scholars, writers/editors, and dozens of other callings, each one faithfully taught a confessional theology immovably lashed to God’s holy, inspired, inerrant, authoritative Word. Two of Abner Creek’s staff elders and other ministers in our congregation are SBTS grads, so for all the aforementioned facts and more, we’re pleased to support the SBC’s flagship seminary.
